SJHS made AYP for 2 or more years consecutively:

For 2011-2012, St. Johns High School made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English language arts and mathematics. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.

Comprehensive High School:

St. Johns High School is a comprehensive school that includes courses in industrial arts, computer education, English, the arts, world languages, mathematics, physical education, social studies, and science. Our students also have the opportunity to participate in 21 varsity sports, performing arts, and a variety of clubs.

Parent Participation:

At St. Johns High School we hold Parent/Teacher Conferences three times per year. In the 2010-11 School Year approximately 436 (35%) of the students were represented at each conference. In the 2011-12 School Year the approximate number was 468 (37%) of the students were represented at each conference. We also hold a curriculum night at the beginning of each school year. The purpose is to inform parents about the curriculum each of their student's is experiencing.

College Credit for Dual Enrollment:

St. Johns High School accepts external credit from colleges and universities with prior administrative approval. In 2011-12, four of the 516 students eligible for dual enrollment took advantage of this opportunity.

Advanced Placement Courses:

St. Johns High School offers Advanced Placement Courses to all of our students; although primarily Juniors and Seniors make up the enrollment in these courses. Six advanced placement courses are offered yearly, which include English, Calculus, US History, Psychology, Chemistry, and Biology.
