# **Back to School Information**

August 6, 2021

Dear SJPS Families,

On behalf of the St. Johns Board of Education and our district staff, we hope your family is enjoying some well-deserved time together this summer. We all look forward to the students returning on Monday, August 30, 2021.

There have been many questions about what COVID-19 protocols will be in place at the start of the year. Over the past year and a half, SJPS has followed all federal, state, and/or local agencies requirements when it comes to COVID-19 mitigation strategies. We plan to continue to do so this school year. Our board of education will be confirming these plans at the August 9, 2021 board meeting. Following is what you can expect when school begins:

# **Student Instruction Days**

All student days will be in-person days. We will not have asynchronous days this school year unless high transmission rates force the district to move to online instruction.

#### **Masks**

Face coverings will be optional/encouraged for students and staff regardless of their vaccination status. It is strongly encouraged that masks be worn by all, especially when indoors but we believe this is a parent choice to make. Masks will be required on all transportation until such time that this restriction is lifted by the federal government. Please note that our goal is to maintain masks as being optional, however, high transmission rates of COVID-19 within our schools or community or if mandated may compel the district to make mask wearing a requirement.

## **COVID-19 Vaccination**

There will be <u>no requirement for students to be vaccinated</u> for COVID-19 unless required by federal or state agencies. There will be no separation between students who are vaccinated or not vaccinated. SJPS believes this is a parent choice.

# **COVID-19 Testing**

At this time, there is no requirement for schools to test for COVID-19. SJPS will only do this if mandated by local, state agency, or sanctioning bodies such as the MHSAA for student athletes.

### **Cohorts**

Elementary students will eat lunch together as a classroom cohort. Students will not be separated by classroom while outdoors for recess. High transmission rates may force us to make adjustments to this plan.

#### Student Illness

It is an expectation that if your child is ill, he/she stays home from school at least until the contagious period has passed. This includes all forms of illness. If your child is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19, it is recommended that he/she is tested at a testing facility. Anyone that is positive for COVID-19 is expected to remain isolated from the public for a period of at least 10 days or as otherwise directed by the health department.

## **Contact Tracing**

Schools are required to report communicable diseases to their local health department within 24 hours. Positive or probable COVID-19 cases will be reported to the Mid-Michigan District Health Department following our Immunizations and Communicable Disease Board Policy 5713 and Michigan Law Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978. When there is a positive or probable case within a classroom, an exposure notice will be sent home to parent(s) just as we do with other communicable diseases, such as chicken pox.

#### Quarantines

SJPS will continue to quarantine individuals when directed to by the Mid-Michigan District Health Department.

# **Virtual Options**

We believe that the best form of instruction is in-person. A virtual option may be available for those who require it due to extenuating circumstances. Please contact your student's building principal if something other than in-person learning is needed for your family.

### Visitors/Parents

To help minimize the risk of transmission of all illnesses within our school population, we will again be limiting the number of guests within our buildings when possible. You can expect that protocols for any visitors to the district's buildings to be very similar to last year.

### Calendar
