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project HRS presented to the Board of Education last year for the Wilson Center. The Board of Education must determine what they plan to do with this building in the future. Dru Mitchell was present in the audience and also provided additional information on other possible opportunities.

The Board of Education discussed the language, salary and extension of the Superintendent's contract.
