Classroom News



Kindergarten

Kindergarten is focusing on short vowel sounds and making CVC words. They are also becoming great storytellers and writers. They are learning how to think, picture, say, sketch, and write their own stories!



1st Grade

For math time first graders have been working on math word problems. Each student solves the math problem in their own way. Then students share their math thinking. after we have a class discussion on how there can be multiple ways to solve a math problem.

During class whole group reading time students have been comparing character traits between books. They are finding the similarities and differences between the books. Students are able to apply this learning within our classroom environment and

build positive friendships in First grade.

All first graders had an amazing time during the fun run and we had great participation.

2nd Grade

Second graders had the opportunity to go on a field trip to MSU Children's Gardens to support learning. They learned about the plant life cycle, bee life cycle, trees and leaves. Each student also brought home a plant and had a ton of fun learning away from our building.





3rd Grade

Third graders have finished their personal narratives and are moving onto learning about informational reading and writing. We also learned about Michigan's government and its importance.

4th Grade

In 4th grade we just had our first writing celebration of the year where students got the chance to share their published writing piece with the class while enjoying some snacks. We have also been having fun experimenting during science. So far we have made "robot fingers" and a working model of our eye!



5th Grade
