Kindergarten

We have been busy here in kindergarten. We have been working on our ABC Bootcamp which means we are learning one letter a day along with learning words that begin with the sound and how to form the letter. The students are also learning how to count using a one to one correspondence and exploring math tools. We have been practicing responsibility and how to be a classroom family. I

am looking forward to an October filled with learning!

1st Grade

First graders have been learning the 3 ways to read a book and how to write about reading. We also explored the life cycle of the Monarch butterfly.



2nd Grade

3rd Grade
